

In 2022, we served a record-breaking 4.6 million meals across Minnesota. # The story of Loaves & Fishes

For 40 years, we have been providing meals, comfort, and kindness to our neighbors in need. While our programming has evolved over four decades, our mission has stayed the same: "To provide healthy meals to Minnesotans in areas where the need is greatest."

Our **community meal program** originated in January of 1982 serving guests at Dorothy Day House in St. Paul and St. Stephen's in Minneapolis. Over the years, we continued partnering with local churches and community centers to provide Minnesotans a place to come inside and share a free meal together.

In 2008, we began providing meals and snacks to students in after school and youth programs through the **Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)**.

We also joined the **Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)** to reduce the gap in school-programmed lunches and snacks while children are out of school during the summer months.

Our **food rescue program** began in 2014 as a unique solution to reducing food waste while meeting our community's needs for accessible, nutritious, and fresh food. We saw a rising demand for more meals across Minnesota and an opportunity to reduce food waste and carbon emissions from the planet. What originated in partnerships with local cafeterias to offset the operational cost of our free community meal sites expanded to various partnerships that include, but are not limited to, restaurants, businesses, and schools.

Years later, we became a solution for local businesses to reduce the impact of their food waste. We moved into a larger warehouse in Southeast Minneapolis and became the first and only redistributor of Second Harvest Heartland food in Minnesota. This led to the creation of our **HUB program** through which we are a resource for local nonprofits to purchase our food inventory at a deep discount to meet the needs of their communities while cutting down on food costs.

As we continued to grow and find hunger where it is at, we brought our **street outreach program** to life. Our staff delivers meals and groceries to people experiencing homelessness on a weekly basis to provide reliable sustenance and support to our community.

Over the years, we've gotten to know many of the faces and stories of those living within our community. While learning about our guests, we identified a need for advocacy and resources. In response, we began our **advocacy program** in 2019. Our Director of Advocacy reduces the barrier to receiving assistance by providing guidance and social service referrals at meal sites, via email, and over the phone.

In 2020, we opened our first commissary kitchen and hired chefs to cook bulk amounts of protein and produce to be packaged into to-go meals for our guests.


The next year, we developed **Cooking For All** – a curriculum to educate staff, volunteers, meal partners, students, and youth groups on how to cook while incorporating low-waste cooking techniques to save on food costs and reduce food waste.

Since 1982, we've strategically cultivated new initiatives to meet community needs as they have arisen. We are dedicated to expanding access to free, nutritious meals for all Minnesotans. We still have a long way to go, but we know we can do it with supporters like you who make our work possible.




# What does it mean to rescue food?

According to the USDA, about 30-40 percent of the food supply in the United States is discarded into municipal landfills. This food waste generates high quantities of carbon dioxide and methane – powerful greenhouse gases that trap heat in the atmosphere. According to the McKnight Foundation, the Midwest is the world's sixth-largest producer of greenhouse gas emissions.

We aim to be a multi-faceted solution to this problem. Our food rescue team captures wholesome, nutritious food from partnering restaurants, schools, and businesses that would otherwise go to landfills. We find ways to creatively repurpose rescued food to meet the need of free, healthy meals in our community.



# What does it mean to serve a meal?

We prepare, package, and serve nutritious meals to guests at our community meal sites hosted at churches, schools, and community centers. Our guests can receive any number of meals needed for their household and are welcome to take meals for family members, friends, and neighbors in need. Our meals are packed with protein, fruits, and vegetables to ensure we are nurturing our guests – not just feeding them.

In addition to our community meal sites, we serve meals to the community through our street outreach program, the HUB, and CACFP/SFSP.








# Financial Statement
